

## Nataliia Viatkina

Nataliia Viatkina is a philosopher and scholar, who has been studying philosophical problems in the field of formal logic, analytical philosophy, cognitive science, and philosophy of mind and language for more than three decades.

Viatkina is a senior scientific researcher with the Hryhory Skovoroda Institute of Philosophy at the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine (since 1975) where for many years she worked under the leadership and in co-operation with a well-known Ukrainian Philosopher and Academician Myroslav Popovych (1930-2018).

Nataliia is also a lecturer at the Ukrainian-American Liberal Arts Institute "Wisconsin International University Ukraine" (Concordia University) where she teaches an MBA course in Research Methods in Business and a course in Philosophy to international students from Africa, Asia, and the Caucasus.

Formerly, Viatkina served as a Coordinator of Research Programs at the NGO Center of Social Prognosing and as a Program Coordinator at the American Councils for Collaboration in Education & Language Studies (ACCELS). She also served as the Executive Director of the Transformation of Humanities in Ukraine Program at the International Renaissance Foundation.

In 2015-2016, Viatkina was the director of the Institute of Education Content Modernization, a state scientific institution with the Ministry of Education of Ukraine where she contributed to the reform of the Ukrainian education system.

Nataliia developed and implemented an array of education programs and projects including, among many more, a National Program for teachers and scientists in producing textbooks and teaching aids for schools and universities in the field of Humanities and Social Sciences, a project for the U.S. Embassy Department for Science and Culture on writing and publishing a book on Teaching Experience, a STEM Education and Philosophy for Children project, special short courses in Language and Power for journalists (Odessa, 2008), Writing and Social Action (Kyiv State University, 2006, 2007), a course for Social Work Education professionals (NauKMA, 2003), workshops on Critical Thinking for University professors, and a Summer School for Young Philosophers of Ukraine, round-table discussions with sociologists, journalists, editors, scientists on the issues of Life Quality, Book Editing, and on Water issues in Ukraine.

Nataliia has authored more than 50 academic and popular publications, among them chapters in 15 collective monographs and one individual monograph 'Sense and Ontology in Logic'.

She provides individual and group consultancy in Project Writing, Scientific Research Writing, Project Based Learning, Decision Making, and Critical Thinking in Education and Business.

Nataliia is a graduate of the Kyiv National Taras Shevchenko University and is a Ph.D. in philosophy. She is a member of the International Association of American Studies and a board member of the Ukraine-France Association.
